


The maternal mortality ratio in the Seychelles has improved from 44 in 2000 to 3 in 2020. Maternal mortality in the Seychelles is lower than its regional average. Maternal mortality ratio is the number of women who die from pregnancy-related causes while pregnant or within 42 days of pregnancy termination per 100,000 live births.


In the Seychelles, the rate of adolescent fertility has decreased since 2010. The rate in 2021 was higher than the average rate in its income group.


102.8% of girls and 93.1% of boys complete lower secondary school in the Seychelles as of 2022 data

The gap in lower secondary completion rate between boys and girls, 9.8, is larger than the gap of the Sub-Saharan Africa aggregate, 3.1. Lower secondary education completion rate measures how many children have completed the last grade of lower secondary education regardless of age completed.



Adult literacy in the Seychelles is nearly the same among women and men (2020)

In the Seychelles, both women and men have very high literacy rates. Adult literacy rate is the percentage of people ages 15 and above who can both read and write with understanding a short simple statement about their everyday life.



Women in parliaments are the percentage of parliamentary seats in a single or lower chamber held by women. The proportion of seats held by women in the Seychelles has remained roughly the same as 2010. The current rate is lower than the average rate in high-income countries.
